TICKETS AND DISCOUNTS

Early bird discount

Until 11 May 2025 inclusive, there is a discount of 10 % on ticket sales.

Children, school pupils and students (up to 30 years of age),

federal volunteers and the unemployed will receive a discount of 50 % on all available tickets on presentation of relevant ID. This cannot be combined with the earlybird discount.

Family ticket

Families receive discounted admission to productions for young audiences. A family ticket is valid for two to five people, at least one being a child and one an adult. This ticket can be selected directly in the webshop.

School groups

Classes and school courses of 10 or more receive tickets for 5 € per pupil and per accompanying person (max. two per class / course) for all performances. Subject to availability, tickets for school classes and courses can be reserved until after the Northrhine-Westphalia summer holidays (14 days before the performance at the latest). For direct booking without prior reservation, tickets must be booked at least seven working days before the performance.

Accompanying persons (severely disabled pass B)

Persons with a severe disability with ID B will receive two tickets together with their accompanying person at the full price of one ticket. Tickets can be booked via the ticket hotline at +49 (0)221 280 210, or at the box office.

Interdisciplinary music theatre about life

Inspired by the music of Nina Simone and Frank Sinatra, *I Did It My Way* tells the story of a breakup between two opposites: a man who clings to the idea of love as something unchanging and a woman who embraces transformation, no matter the cost. She, a Black woman, finds her purpose in the civil rights movement, her voice rising in passion and protest. He, a white man, remains in Watertown, unable to move on. Rooted in the familiar, he retreats into nostalgia, searching for meaning in the past instead of the future. Her growth exhilarates her. He is left behind in a life that no longer fits. Their feelings unfold solely through music – duets and solos that weave together love and longing, harmony and discord, liberation and loss. *I Did It My Way* is inspired by the legacy of two legendary American musicians: Frank Sinatra and Nina Simone. The rising interdisciplinary artist Larissa Sirah Herden (Lary) – her latest film project was awarded with a Grimme-Preis – and Lars Eidinger, one of the most famous faces of the German theatre and film landscape, embody the conflicted couple, accompanied by four dancers and a swinging big band.

We Are The Lucky Ones

A song and dance of life and death

They are “The lucky ones”: A generation born in Europe between 1940 and 1949, into the aftershocks of the Second World War and the peace, economic growth and rapid globalisation that followed. Today, many of this generation are the richest and most powerful people on earth – and, arguably, responsible for a world that is in many ways worse than the one they grew up in. A world in which the prevailing hope – next generations will always do better than the previous one – is faltering, fast. Playwright Nina Segal and director Ted Huffman have assembled a mosaic portrait of a generation, based on verbatim interviews with members of this group. Composer Philip Venables has used these to create his first grand opera with sumptuous orchestral sounds and intimate arias. He turns the most important moments of individual lives into a collective collage, finding a theatrical form for the social change of recent decades, interlacing the political and the personal. Polish-Lebanese conductor Bassem Akiki will conduct the Bochumer Symphoniker. “They say, don’t they — we are a lucky generation. We are the lucky ones. Did better than our parents, most of us.” (from *We Are The Lucky Ones*)

World premiere

A theatrical multimedia exploration into Alan Turing, AI, and the dark soul of technology

Alan Turing was a pioneer of modern computer technology: he cracked the Enigma code and helped the British government to shorten the Second World War. Nonetheless, the same government persecuted him for his sexual orientation. Łukasz Twarkowski returns to Ruhrtriennale with Oracle, a multimedia theatre piece by playwright Anka Herbut. Together, they explore Turing's tragic life and legacy. Set in post-war Britain and a timeless digital realm, Oracle examines the politicization of technology. Through immersive soundscapes and cinematic projections, it blurs reality and illusion, questioning whether advanced technology is indistinguishable from magic. Visually stunning and provocative, Oracle reflects on Turing's secrets, prophetic insights, and the AI-shaped future he helped create.

Guernica Guernica

FC Bergman / Toneelhuis Antwerpen
World premiere

A wordless multimedia stage production about the impossibility of representing war

Inspired by Picasso's painting *Guernica*, theatre collective FC Bergman, Silver Lion winners at the Venice Biennale 2023, created a daring exploration of how we watch war. From raw footage to art and film, media shapes our perception, yet the spectacle confronts the impossibility of truly representing war. Do images bring us closer to reality, or alienate us? The stage becomes a war zone – part theatre, part living artwork – framed by two opposing grandstands. The innovative theatre piece *Guernica Guernica* works exclusively with images, music, and mass scenes. The production focuses on the threefold roles of victim, perpetrator, and ultimate the spectators. FC Bergman highlights the absurdity of war representation and critiques the commercialization of war imagery as well as societal paralysis in the face of conflict.

Falaise

Camille Decourtye / Blaï Mateu Trias / Baro d'èvel

An imperturbable white horse amid the cacophony of life

It's like being catapulted into a Fellini film. Falaise, French for "cliff", is a sight to behold, raw and poetic at the same time. The Franco-Catalan theatre, dance and circus troupe Baro d'èvel performs in a chaotic, crumbling scenery: Walls pierced with holes, spilling out performers in a whirlwind of constant motion. Between absurd humor and tender interactions, contradictions of human existence are revealed. A living fresco, executed in black and white, that is constantly transformed through acrobatic contortions, slapstick, animals, dance and music. With eight performers, a white horse and a flock of pigeons, Falaise is a poetic work of art about the downfall and resurrection of humanity. Suitable for families with children 10 and older, the company uses acrobatics, dance and music to show that the end of the world can also be full of beauty.

Celebration of Baroque styles and South American mythologies

Impressive vitality, expression and rhythms characterize the dance and music in Argentine folklore. It carries stories of the indigenous inhabitants of South America and shows traces of European cultures. Modern imperialism has pushed these traditions into the background. Laisné, Chaignaud and Larcher convey them into their artistic process. In a hypnotic mix of songs and dances they transform Baroque aesthetics and South American mythologies into a festive performance.

Imagine a flower field in a desert. That is one treasure of Okiep, a former mining region that embodies the history of colonised South Africa. The inimitable, rebellious South African choreographer Robyn Orlin explores the mechanisms of violence and oppression in the area. Together with six dancers of Garage Dance Ensemble and two musicians, Orlin mixes fiction and reality, allowing the message to emerge: Everybody has the right to blossom.

Mohamed Toukabri

A search for autonomy

"The upside-down man", that's how the Belgo-Tunisian choreographer and dancer Mohamed Toukabri named himself in his first solo. Known for his ability to navigate between worlds – be it street and stage, hip hop and postmodernism, personal and political – Toukabri now turns his sharp choreographic eye to the very architecture of dance itself. He digs into his own body like an archaeologist, exploring the different layers of dance within him. At the same time, he tries to create an opening, a decolonization of his imagination. What responsibility do we have in what we transmit, erase, or maintain? We are all involved in the act of reimagination, and this solo is an invitation to reimagine it together.

Ravel's *Boléro* as an immersive techno experience

The composer Maurice Ravel's ideal venue for his superhit *Boléro* was a factory. For his 150th birthday, we will make his wish come true. In the Maschinenhalle at Zeche Zweckel in Gladbeck the French collective Les Apaches ! will put the "rave" into Ravel. Between new Ravel arrangements and a recently discovered *Boléro* Jazz from 1929, the famous piece, among other works by Ravel, is transformed from an orchestral work into a trance-like electro trip by composer Fabien Cali. Visually, 3D-projections of dancers merge with virtual backgrounds, inviting the public to join the dance party. A Live Set by French-Cameroonian DJ Tatyana Jane continues the celebration.

A new understanding of nature in sound

"Mother Nature" is dead. Human beings have irrevocably changed nature. David Lang, one of the world's most successful avant-garde composers, has been inspired by classics of environmental literature in his latest work. Tal Rosner creates video projections especially for *before and after nature*, which show nostalgic images and at the same time open up new perspectives. With this concert Chorwerk Ruhr celebrates its 25th anniversary with the New York instrumental ensemble Bang on a Can All-Stars.

124 Years of Reverb

Organ meditation by Radiohead legend in Essen's "mineworkers' cathedral"

124 Years of Reverb is an eight-hour work by the composer and Radiohead guitarist Jonny Greenwood. The organ sounds generate an enveloping sonic space that



makes every corner of the church vibrate with history. The historic “mineworkers’ cathedral” hosts a communal music-meditation. Two organists will make use of the complete tonal spectrum of the 124-year-old Wilhelm Sauer organ. This is the first time that Katernberg Church will be a venue for Ruhrtriennale. Visitors can immerse themselves in this vibrant soundscape for the full duration of eight hours or in two-hour segments.

Erased Music: Tribute to Wendy Carlos

Will Gregory Moog Ensemble

Homage to a pioneer of electronic music

Wendy Carlos is one of the most significant living artists in the history of electronic music. Alongside her scores for Stanley Kubrick’s films *A Clockwork Orange*, *The Shining* and Disney’s *Tron* she made music history with her album *Switched on Bach* (1968), where she translated classical baroque music into innovative electronic sounds. This revolutionary album made her the first trans woman to win a Grammy. The festival series Erased Music focusses on musicians that have been unjustly forgotten. He writes songs about racism and other tough topics that reflect the reality of many Black people in the USA. Tyshawn Sorey, winner of the 2024 Pulitzer Prize for Music, is just as adept at new music as he is at jazz and finds new forms with every task he confronts. With the song cycle *Cycles of My Being* and the 20-minute countertenor aria *Save the Boys*, he takes his place among the great art song composers.

Gaye Su Akyol has been hailed by publications such as the New York Times as “Turkish rock music’s biggest hope”, drawing on the psychedelic music of 1970s Turkey and folk icons such as Selda Bağcan.

Sopranista from Venezuela brings queer Glamour into historically informed performances

Conquering the repertoire of opera’s great heroines, for whom Georg Friedrich Handel composed many dazzling arias, he brings a unique presence to the stage. It’s not just his bold, gender-defying style that adds colour to his performances – the accompanying ensemble Capella Cracoviensis plays a key role: The versatile period-instrument orchestra under the baton of Jan Tomasz Adamus enriches industrial heritage venues with the sound of historical instruments.

Through the ears, an immersive sound and innovative theatre experience unfolds for everyone aged 14 and older.

A dance performance with paper art for children under 5 years and families

This is what makes origami, the Japanese art of paper folding, so fascinating. Together with the performers, the children create their own artworks at the beginning of the performance. These are then used to create a story entirely without words, which is performed by two dancers accompanied by live music.

Visionary art in portrait

The Mortier Awards association honors the legacy of Ruhrtriennale's founding artistic director Gerard Mortier who championed bold artistic innovation and societal dialogue. The winners of the Mortier Awards 2025 have been announced: The Ruhrtriennale warmly congratulates conductor Hartmut Haenchen, recipient of the Mortier Award (Lifetime Achievement Award), and director Frieda Lange, recipient of the Mortier Next Generation Award (Emerging Talent Prize). Both artists will be honored on September 21, 2025, at 1:00 PM at Jahrhunderthalle Bochum, in the presence of Ina Brandes, Minister of Culture and Science of the State of North Rhine-Westphalia. The ceremony will be followed by a panel discussion with both artists as part of the Brave New Voices series, focusing on the theme of artistic freedom.

Artists at Work

Artists between screen and stage

The film series Artists at Work showcases the versatility of Ruhrtriennale artists. Every Tuesday in the Turbinenhalle we present a cinematic work featuring a festival artist. Artistic director Ivo Van Hove, Anita van Dolen, Curator for Dance and Programme Director Krystian Lada will open each evening with an inperson interview. This places the spotlight on the people behind these great works, who share what drives and motivates them across mediums.

Will Gregory talks with Ivo Van Hove about his work with electronic music and the influence of Wendy Carlos on music history. The talk will be followed by a screening of the film *Sisters with Transistors* (English with German subtitles, 85 min.), which tells the stories of pioneering female electronic music artists.

02.9: with Robyn Orlin

The documentary *Robyn Orlin, de Johannesburg au Palais Garnier* (English with German subtitles, 90 min) follows her as she creates a piece for the Paris Opera, providing insight into her process and showing the quieter moments that fuel her creative energy. Beforehand, the South African dancer and choreographer talks to curator Anita van Dolen about what inspires her and how she combines work and life in her pieces.

09.9: with Sharon Eyal

The documentary *SOUL CHAIN: Sharon Eyal and the Ballet of the Beats* (English with German subtitles, 45 min) explores the development of her signature blend of precision and expressive freedom, bringing the audience so close to the stage action they feel like part of the choreography. This will be preceded by a talk with Anita van Dolen.

16.9: with David Lang

The documentary *New York Composers: Searching for a New Music* (English with German subtitles, 58 min) takes viewers into the heart of New York's music scene in the late 1990s and offers intimate glimpses of influential composers such as David Lang, Philip Glass, and Julia Wolfe, who ushered in a new era of music. Beforehand, David Lang talks to programme director Krystian Lada about his artistic development and his philosophy as a composer, among other things.

Kultur Ruhr GmbH in its current form was founded in 2001 and is characterized by the production and mediation of contemporary and interdisciplinary art throughout the Ruhr region. Kultur Ruhr GmbH currently consists of four independent program pillars: Ruhrtriennale, Urbane Künste Ruhr, CHORWERK RUHR and Tanzlandschaft Ruhr. A separate artistic director is appointed for each pillar of Kultur Ruhr GmbH. This gives each area its own independence in terms of content, which is also visible to the outside world. CHORWERK RUHR, PACT Zollverein and Urbane Künste Ruhr contribute to the Ruhrtriennale with artistic projects.

Ruhrtriennale

Every year, the Ruhrtriennale - the festival of the arts - invites contemporary artists to transform the imposing industrial architecture of the Ruhr region into spectacular performance venues for Music Theater, Theatre, Dance, Performance, Concerts, Installations and Visual Arts. The festival, which was launched in 2002, has international appeal and attracts a large number of visitors from Germany and abroad to the region every year. The direction of the program is largely determined by the artistic director, who is newly appointed every three years. The director of the Ruhrtriennale 2024 - 2026 is the Belgian theater and opera director Ivo Van Hove. The artistic directors of previous years were Gerard Mortier (2002 - 2004), Jürgen Flimm (2005 - 2007/extended until 2008 following the death of artistic director Marie Zimmermann), Willy Decker (2009 - 2011), Heiner Goebbels (2012 - 2014), Johan Simons (2015 - 2017), Stefanie Carp (2018 - 2020) and Barbara Frey (2021 - 2023). CHORWERK RUHR – Jubilee year

CHORWERK RUHR is one of the most important chamber choirs in Germany. Founded in 1999, the vocal ensemble performed for the first time in 2000 and has firmly established itself as one of the artistic trademarks of the Ruhr region. A particular quality of the choir is its ability to meet the special requirements of small solo ensembles as well as to achieve a perfect fusion of the ensemble in a full choral sound. Since 2011, the award-winning conductor Florian Helgath has been the artistic director of CHORWERK RUHR. One focus of his work is to relate new choral music to traditional musical forms, thereby creating a new effect on the audience against the backdrop of the choir's rich musical history. The quality of the choir can also be seen in the numerous commissions and world premieres by renowned contemporary composers, which are realized in close cooperation with the partners of CHORWERK RUHR. This year, CHORWERK RUHR is celebrating its 25th concert anniversary. Further information can be found at www.chorwerkruhr.de.

PACT Zollverein

Since its founding in 2002, PACT Zollverein has been the initiator, driving force, laboratory and stage for groundbreaking developments in the fields of dance, performance, theatre, media and visual arts. Stefan Hilterhaus is the artistic director of PACT Zollverein, which he also co-founded. With a structure that is unique in Germany, the house in the heart of the Ruhr region fulfills a regional as well as national and international social and cultural mission in four main areas of work, which contributes to the localization and appreciation of dance and performance as independent art forms: In the residence programme, in which artists from all over the world participate, PACT Zollverein works as an artists' house and creates a space for concentrated work processes. The "Platform" area initiates an exchange between artists, scientists and students from different disciplines and promotes the critical questioning of their methods and results. A third focus is on a high-profile stage program consisting of premieres, co-productions and guest performances. A

further, fourth field lies in projects that focus on the thematic and research field of urban space, question the function and effect of urban space and develop concepts to jointly shape urban society. <https://www.pact-zollverein.de/en>

Urbane Künste Ruhr

Urbane Künste Ruhr is a decentralized institution for contemporary art in the Ruhr Area. Under the artistic direction of Britta Peters, it initiates projects in public space, exhibitions, residency programs and events, often in collaboration with local and international partner institutions. Long-term collaborative projects include the permanent sculpture trail Emscherkunstweg. This year, Urbane Künste Ruhr is realizing - in addition to the international exhibition *Zwischen Erfinden und Erfassen. THE ARTISTIC DIRECTOR AND HIS TEAM

Ivo Van Hove

Ivo Van Hove (Belgium, 1958) started his career as a theatre director in 1981 with his own productions such as "Disease germs" and "Rumours". Even then, he liked to stage his productions in unusual locations such as harbour warehouses, an old laundry or cellars. He was artistic director of the theatre group AKT-Vertikaal and of De Tijd theatre in Antwerp. From 1990 to 2000 he was director of Het Zuidelijk Toneel in Eindhoven and from 1998 to 2004 he managed the Holland Festival in Amsterdam. From 2001 to September 2023, he was director of the Internationaal Theater Amsterdam (ITA), formerly Toneelgroep Amsterdam, the largest theatre company in the Netherlands. In November 2023 he has been appointed as artistic director of the Ruhrtriennale for the 2024–2026 seasons.

Ivo Van Hove's productions have been performed at the Festival d'Avignon, the Edinburgh International Festival, the Venice Biennale, the Holland Festival, the international theatre festival Theater der Welt and the Wiener Festwochen, among others. He has directed the ensembles of La Comédie-Française, Deutsches Schauspielhaus Hamburg, Schaubühne Berlin, Staatstheater Stuttgart, the National Theatre London, Vienna Burgtheater and the New York Theatre Workshop and has worked with actors such as Gillian Anderson, Juliette Binoche, Bryan Cranston, Isabelle Huppert and Jude Law. His productions have been performed all over the world, from New York, London, Chile, Argentina, and Sydney to Taipei.

He directed the musical "Rent" for the theatre and musical producer Joop van den Ende. At the Vlaamse Opera, he staged "Lulu" by Alban Berg and the entire "Ring des Nibelungen" by Richard Wagner (2006–2008). At the Dutch National Opera in Amsterdam, he directed Janáček's "The Makropulos Affair" (2002), Tchaikovsky's "Iolante" (2004), Schreker's "The Treasure Hunter" (2012) and "Salome" (2017) by Richard Strauss. In 2014, he directed the world premiere of the opera "Brokeback Mountain" at the Teatro Real. Van Hove directed "A View from the Bridge" (2015) and "The Crucible" (2016) by Arthur Miller on Broadway. He also directed David Bowie's last work, the Music Theatre show "Lazarus".

In the past, Ivo Van Hove has been invited to the Ruhrtriennale with the co-productions "Die stille Kraft", "Die Dinge, die vorübergehen" and "Kleine Seelen" by Louis Couperus (2015 - 2017), with "Rocco und seine Brüder" by Luchino Visconti (2008) and "Teorema" after Pier Paolo Pasolini (2009).

Ivo Van Hove staged "Network" by Lee Hall with actor Bryan Cranston at the National Theatre in London in 2017. A year later, the production premiered at the Cort Theatre on Broadway. It was nominated for five Tony Awards, the most prestigious American theatre prize. At the National Theatre in London, he also directed "All About Eve" with actress Gillian Anderson and staged Hanya Yanagihara's novel "A Little Life" (2023). Van Hove has directed at the Opéra de Paris, De Nationale Opera Amsterdam, Komische Oper Berlin, De Vlaamse Opera and De Munt in Brussels, among others. In 2023, he made his debut at the Metropolitan Opera New York with two opera productions: Mozart's "Don Giovanni" and "Dead Man Walking" by Jake Heggie. In February 2020, Van Hove and choreographer Anne Teresa de Keersmaecker created a radical new production of the musical "Westside Story", which premiered at the Broadway Theatre in New York. This was immediately followed in March 2020 by Van Hove's production of "The Glass Menagerie" by Tennessee Williams with leading actress Isabelle Huppert, which premiered at the Théâtre de l'Odéon.



At the Toneelgroep Amsterdam, Ivo Van Hove has directed, among others "Angels in America" by Tony Kushner, "Scenes from a Marriage", "After the Rehearsal / Persona" and "Cries and Whispers" by Ingmar Bergman, "Opening Night" and "Husbands" by John Cassavetes, "Osseessione" by Luchino Visconti, the "Antonioni Project" after Michelangelo Antonioni, "The Human Voice" by Jean Cocteau, "Summer Trilogy" by Carlo Goldoni, "Children of the Sun" by Maxim Gorky, "The Miser" by Molière, "Elektra Must Mourn" and "A Long Journey into the Night" by Eugene O'Neill, "The Russians!" by Tom Lanoye after Anton Chekhov, "The Fountainhead" by Ayn Rand, "Maria Stuart" by Friedrich Schiller and his adaptation of Shakespeare's dramas as "marathon performances" lasting several hours.

Van Hove's work has received numerous awards, including two Obie Awards for Best Director in an Off-Broadway production in New York (for "More Stately Mansions" and "Hedda Gabler"), the Flanders Oeuvre Prize (1995), the Theatre Festival Prize (1996), the Archangel Award at the Edinburgh Festival (1999) and the Commandeur dans l'Ordre des Arts et des Lettres (2004) in France and Commander in the Order of the Crown in Belgium. In 2007 he was honoured with the Critic's Award in the Netherlands. In 2008, together with Jan Versweyveld, he received the Prosceniumprijs, a Dutch work prize, and in 2012 the Amsterdam Business Oeuvre Award. In 2014, Van Hove received an honorary doctorate for general merit from the University of Antwerp and the Flemish Minister of Culture, Sven Gatz, awarded him the Flemish Culture Prize for general cultural merit. In 2015, Van Hove was honoured with two Olivier Awards for "A View from the Bridge" and the Amsterdam Award for the Arts, together with Jan Versweyveld. In 2016, Ivo Van Hove received two Tony Awards, two Drama League Awards, two Drama Desk Awards, two Outer Critics Circle Awards and two Grands Prix de la Critique. In December 2023, he received the Gold Medal of the Royal Flemish Academy of Belgium for Science and Art.
